Lent Course - Starting Wednesday 26 March on Zoom with Rev. Naomi

You are warmly invited to join friends from Eccles, Hextable, Larkfield (including Burham), Tonbridge Road and Union Street for a condensed four-week Lent course over Zoom on Wednesday evenings, starting on 26 March at 7.45pm (and then on 2, 9 and 16 April). We'll be using resources based on the film 'The Greatest Showman,' so do watch the film beforehand if you get the chance (it's currently available to watch on Disney+, if you have a subscription). Rev. Naomi's Weekly Message:

Dear friends,

I wonder what makes you angry? Not 'accidentally-stepped-on-a-Lego-brick' angry, but truly angry. Many of us, I'm sure, will have felt a rising tide of anger last week as we watched footage on Friday of President Zelensky of Ukraine being interrupted and berated at the White House by the American President and Vice-President. Anger is a very natural human emotion - one we see Jesus wrestle with in the Gospels. We are exposed to so many stories in the news of cruelty and injustice, and our response - understandably - is often one of anger. But if our anger simply festers inside us, it can quickly turn to bitterness. One of my favourite readings for the season of Lent, which began yesterday, is Isaiah <u>58:6-11</u>, which reminds that the kind of fasting God truly desires from us is to stop 'pointing fingers' and 'talking maliciously' and instead to turn our anger outwards, allowing it to drive us to 'loose the chains of injustice' and to ensure that the hungry are fed. In another reading we often hear during Lent, Jesus did just this when he became angry at the sight of ordinary people being taken advantage of by salespeople and money-changers in the temple courts. He overturned their tables and benches in an act of holy protest. So, this Lent, perhaps part of our discipline is to recognise the righteous anger within ourselves - and to allow it to drive us to reshape the world around us. Support for the Church in Eccles

Several of you have asked me how we might support our friends at the Church in Eccles. Eccles, , has seen some exciting developments recently - in recent weeks, we have received three new members, and a visit from the local school with whom we are building stronger ties. Several members have also taken on new roles, after Stella stepped down as Senior Steward after 56 years of faithful service. However, the church is still small (16 members) and fairly fragile, especially in terms of finance - last month, there was only £373.77 in the bank, which is far from sustainable, and the church is entirely dependent on income from the preschool. Like Burham, Eccles is the only church building in the village, and we would be grateful for any help to safeguard its future. Here are some suggestions if you wish to help:

1.Make a **financial donation.** The account details are: Eccles Methodist Church Council, sort code: 30 95 37, account number: 48903468. If you are eligible for Gift Aid, please ask me for a form, so we can claim the extra 25% at no cost to you.

2. Organise a fundraiser (Larkfield are excellent at those!).

3.If you are a **Worship Leader**, consider whether you could offer an occasional service at Eccles. To do this, Eccles' Church Council would need to appoint you as one of 'their' WLs.

4.Help to build the relationship with the local school. Pupils will be coming to the church for **Easter workshops** on Monday 31 March, and we are also planning a **Messy Church** on Wednesday 9 April at 2pm. If you could help with either, please let me know.

5.And most importantly - pray!
